About Tasmania

Tasmania is Australia's smallest and most southerly state, and it is the only island state of Australia. It is located 250 kilometres (150 miles) south of the Australian mainland, separated by Bass Strait.

Tasmania has a cool temperate climate with four distinct seasons and rarely experiences hot or cold extremes. The population of Tasmania is approximately 512,000 with nearly half (216,000) residing in the greater Hobert area.

Tasmania boasts pristine white beaches, access to the freshest and largest variety of produce and multiple cultural experiences. The beauty of Tasmania is complemented by the friendliness of its locals. Tasmania offers high levels of public safety, short commuting times, an inspiring lifestyle and vibrant welcoming communities.

Tasmania is just a short 55 minute plane trip from Melbourne or 90 minutes from Sydney. Regular flights are scheduled in and out of Hobart that align with international flight arrival and departure times.

About the School

Our main campus is located five kilometres from Hobart's city centre with expansive grounds overlooking the picturesque River Derwent and the University of Tasmania is next door. The Hutchins School has modern classrooms, state-of-the-art science and computer laboratories, two libraries, high-speed broadband connection, a Performing Arts Centre, a chapel and a newly redeveloped boarding house. Our extensive sporting facilities include three playing fields, a gymnasium, one fully equipped rowing training facility and six tennis courts.

At Hutchins we provide learning spaces specifically designed for teaching boys, this includes providing resources and designing programs that meet their educational and developmental needs. International students are an important part of The Hutchins School community. Our community celebrates cultural diversity and enjoys global networking opportunities.

Boarding provides an opportunity for boys to be mentored and supported in a welcoming environment as they embark on their Hutchins journey. Importantly, they have the chance to share these experiences through the friendships they build – many of which last a lifetime.

The School's boarding facility is of a worldclass standard. Students enjoy spacious, modern, attractively furnished rooms and bathrooms and welcoming leisure areas. including a games room, kitchenette and theatre room. Boarders have access to the Schools' sporting facilities including a multi-court indoor sports gym, a weights room and a circuit room. On the weekends boarders enjoy a range of activities including bushwalking and sailing, taking in Tasmania's spectacular scenery and waterways. Sports such as indoor cricket, hockey, soccer, touch football and basketball are on offer as well as cultural activities including gallery visits and an art group. Boarders' meals are often the envy of day students with our chef catering for all dietary requirements and providing a variety of delicious meals.

Boarders are very fortunate to enjoy a genuine family atmosphere in Burbury House. They are surrounded by real families and mentors who are dedicated to providing a safe and secure, structured but enjoyable environment to support learning and co-curricular activities.

Co-operating schools

Interaction with girls is of great importance and this is achieved socially through drama, activities and events whilst still giving the Hutchins students the opportunity to learn independently in an environment tailored for them. In Years 11–12 a unique co-operating schools model exists where students may attend subjects at our sister school St Michael's Collegiate, and our co-operating school, Fahan School.
